- **I UDINE01** will send its decision (information package) within 8 weeks at the maximum from the reception of the nomination letter.

- Erasmus incoming student at **I UDINE01** has to collect the Transcript of Records before leaving Udine, otherwise the Transcript of Records will be issued and sent by I UDINE01 no later than 5 weeks directly to the personal post address of the student.

Termination or modification of the agreement:

A unilateral decision to discontinue or to change the exchanges notified to the other party by September 20/./ will only take effect from the October of the following new academic year.

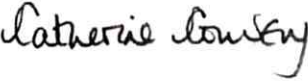

<b>Credit System and Course Load</b>	UCD uses the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS). A full course load is 30 credits per semester. At undergraduate level each module is worth 5 credits and students take six modules per semester. Exchange students may take fewer modules if permitted by their home institution.

<b>Results of Examinations</b>	Examination results are released online to all students and they are notified by email regarding the date they will be available. Students are later sent a formal Statement of Results by post, to their home address.

<b>Student Visa</b>	Students with citizenship of countries listed in the appendices of the International Students Handbook do not require a student visa to enter Ireland but must register with immigration after arrival in Dublin.  Information on registration with immigration is available in section 3 of the International Students Handbook and will be further explained at orientation. Students with citizenship of a country <b>not</b> listed in the appendices of the International Students Handbook must contact their local Irish embassy for information about visa application.  <b>Important:</b> Visas valid for the Schengen countries are NOT valid for Ireland.
