#### At the University of Udine:

The original transcript of records (no carbon copy is accepted) with the exams done by the Italian student can be given or sent directly to him/her OR to the International Relations and Mobility Office of I UDINE01.

The Learning Agreement or the changed Learning Agreement has to be given to the Italian student who will submit to the approval of the professor coordinator.

#### E MADRIDO3

- The number of students you will send to E MADRID03 may by no means exceed the number of students
  mentioned in this agreement. More specifically, we do not accept the mechanism by which shorter periods
  of stay allow for the sending of more students, i.e. on an exchange of 1 student for 10 months, you may
  not freely send 2 students for 5 months, not even if their stay covers different semesters. Please take this
  into consideration when organising your students selection.
- Complutense University has facilities for students with a learning or physical disability. Disabled students
  can rely on the support service "Office for the Integration of Persons with Disabilities", which offers

- Staff Mobility for Training and for Teaching: Complutense University welcomes applications from foreign
  Staff for a training/teaching period, however it is at the discretion of the department concerned whether
  or not to accept a staff visitor. Applications must be sent to <a href="mailto:rrinter@ucm.es">rrinter@ucm.es</a> at least two months prior to
  the desired training/teaching period. The training/teaching period cannot be scheduled during Summer
  (i.e. July-August) in the Academic year.
- Master students need to have the approval of the Master coordinators of our Faculty to take Master courses.
- Master level students (2 nd cycle) must have passed 240 ECTS credits.- students will provide the following documents to the International Relations office of corresponding Faculty/School:- CV, transcript of records and motivation letter. The learning agreement of the student must be approved by the master's coordinator.
- Admission to a specific course is subject to the exchange student being satisfactorily qualified for the chosen area of study and/or course level, and availability
- PhD students need to send a master certificate to the International Relations office of corresponding Faculty/School. . PhD students will only receive ECTS credits if they complete courses at the host institution. Therefore, they will not receive any ECTS credits from the host institution for PhD-related research they undertake. The home institution is responsible for accrediting PhD students with ECTS credits for research completed at the host institution.
- It is not possible for student to hand-in their final MA/PhD Thesis at the host institution. Final theses need to be graded by the home institution.
- Full time credit load at each UCM: Students will be awarded ECTS credits when they have passed the assessments corresponding to the courses to which ECTS credits are allocated.
  - 1 full academic year= 60 credits
  - 1 semester= 30 credits
  - 1 term/ trimester= 15 credits

- Partner Universities have to send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by e-mail (to <u>iss@uniud.it</u>). **I UDINE01** cannot guarantee the acceptance of another modality to nominate Erasmus students by partner Universities (such as online nominations etc...).
- I UDINE01 will send its decision (information package) within 8 weeks at the maximum from the reception of the nomination letter.
- Erasmus incoming student at **I UDINE01** has to collect the Transcript of Records before leaving Udine, otherwise the Transcript of Records will be issued and sent by I UDINE01 no later than 5 weeks directly to the personal post address of the student.

Termination or modification of the agreement:

A unilateral decision to discontinue or to change the exchanges notified to the other party by September 20/../ will only take effect from the October of the following new academic year.
