2. The I UDINE01 will send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by e-mail. It cannot be guaranteed another modality to nominate Erasmus students from I UDINE01 (such as online nominations etc.).

3. Partner Universities have to send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by e-mail (to iss@uniud.it). It cannot be guaranteed the acceptance of another modality to nominate Erasmus students by partner Universities (such as online nominations etc.).

4. The I UDINE01 will send its decision (information package) within 8 weeks at the maximum from the reception of the nomination letter.

5. Erasmus incoming student at the I UDINE01 has to collect the Transcript of Records before leaving Udine, otherwise the Transcript of Records will be issued and sent by the I UDINE01 no later than 5 weeks directly to the personal post address of the student.

6. Termination or modification of the agreement:

A unilateral decision to discontinue or to change the exchanges notified to the other party by September 20/./ will only take effect from the October of the following new academic year.



All Chinese nationals must get an IELTS or iBT/TOEFL (min. score 90) certificate in order to get a <u>Nuffic Certificate</u> , which is needed for the issuance of their visa and residence permits.

Accommodation	Student housing in Leiden is limited, especially in Fall when there is most demand. Students may therefore also be offered housing in The Hague. For the best chance of securing housing through the university, students should ensure they pay their (non-refundable) housing fee of €350 prior to the housing deadline of June 1st for the Fall semester and November 15th for the Spring semester, even if they have not yet been admitted to the programme. In the unfortunate event a student is not admitted, this fee will be refunded. Other costs, such as the refundable €500 housing deposit, are due before students arrive. * *This information is subject to change. For the most up-to-date information on the exact

Visa and residence permits	<p>Students with a non-EU nationality must get a Dutch residence permit, and in many cases, an entry visa to the Netherlands as well. Please keep in mind that this applies to all Erasmus students with a non-EU passport, even if they have a student residence permit in another Schengen country. Once a student has been admitted to an exchange period at Leiden University, the Admissions Office will work with the student to apply for these documents on their behalf. Students should note that there is a fee of €300 for visas/permits (this fee is subject to change). To allow enough time to obtain these documents, it is imperative that all Erasmus students who are non-EU citizens submit their applications to Leiden before the abovementioned deadlines. http://www.prospectivestudents.leiden.edu/practical-info/visa/.</p>
Insurance	<p>All students are obliged to have health insurance to cover any medical costs incurred during their stay. We strongly recommend that students ensure they have medical insurance before their arrival. Arrival	<p>There is a train that runs directly from Schiphol Airport to Leiden Central station (about 20 minutes travel time) or the Hague Central Station (about 30 minutes). On arrival in Leiden, students should report to the Visitor Centre directly across from Leiden Central Station. On arrival in the Hague, students should report to the student desk located at Schouwburgstraat 2 (a 10-minute walk from the Central Station).</p>
