2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 4 weeks.
3. Issue of the **Transcript of Records**

D DRESDEN02: The faculties issue Transcripts of Records (documenting credits earned at the TU Dresden). Every student must pick up the transcript him/herself! The TU Dresden will NOT automatically send your transcript to your home university. If the student's exam grades are not yet

available when you leave, please make arrangements with the proper office to have your transcript sent to you.

- **I UDINE01** will send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by e-mail. It cannot be guaranteed another modality to nominate Erasmus students from I UDINE01.
- Partner Universities have to send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by e-mail (to iss@uniud.it). **I UDINE01** cannot guarantee the acceptance of another modality to nominate Erasmus students by partner Universities (such as online nominations etc...).
- **I UDINE01** will send its decision (information package) within 8 weeks at the maximum from the reception of the nomination letter.
- Erasmus incoming student at **I UDINE01** has to collect the Transcript of Records before leaving Udine, otherwise the Transcript of Records will be issued and sent by I UDINE01 no later than 5 weeks directly to the personal post address of the student.

4. Termination of the agreement

Termination or modification of the agreement:
 A unilateral decision to discontinue or to change the exchanges notified to the other party by September 20/./ will only take effect from the October of the following new academic year.

The involved institutions agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the inter-institutional agreement. In the event of termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."

F. Information

1. Grading systems of the institutions

D DRESDEN02: The grading scale ranges from 1 to 5, in which 1 stands for "excellent/very good", 2 for "good", 3 for "satisfactory", 4 for "sufficient" and 5 for "not satisfactory". Passing grades may also be qualified decimal numbers such as 0.3 or 0.7 to indicate tendencies towards the next grade.

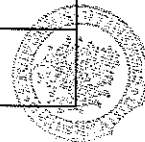
