- Partner Universities have to send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by e-mail (to iss@uniud.it). I UDINEO1 cannot guarantee the acceptance of another modality to nominate Erasmus students by partner Universities (such as online nominations etc...).
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
- I UDINEO1 will send its decision (information package) within 8 weeks at the maximum from the reception of the nomination letter.

- Erasmus incoming student at **I UDINEO1** has to collect the Transcript of Records before leaving Udine, otherwise the Transcript of Records will be issued and sent by I UDINEO1 no later than 5 weeks directly to the personal post address of the student.

4. Termination of the agreement

In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1.
